


Three Takeaways

- Each data source has its own pros and cons the key is understanding what your needs are and measuring it consistently over time.


Different Numbers, Similar Stories All Sources Show Colorado's Uninsurance Rate Declining



Different Numbers, Similar Stories With the Drop in Uninsured Comes a Medicaid Surge




Colorado is in the Middle of the Pack


Who are the Remaining Uninsured?

They tend to have lower incomes than other Coloradans




Who are the Remaining Uninsured?

They are half as likely to work for a large employer











- Current Population Survey (CPS)
 - Monthly US Census economic survey
 - Asks robust health insurance questions
 - Small sample size, trending issues





From the Sidelines

Some Lesser-Known Resources

- National Health Interview Survey (NHIS)
 - National survey
 - Comprehensive list of health topics
 - Small sample size, little detail
- Gallup
 - Monthly poll
 - Generally considered unreliable (a quick estimate)


