











Numbers of Uninsured Coloradans, 2009-2015
















The Drop in Uninsured is a Story of Medicaid Expansion

Changes in Health Insurance Coverage, All Ages, San Luis Valley, 2013-2015




Employer-Sponsored Medicare Medicaid/Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+)



Uninsured Rate by Health Statistics Region, 2015



Uninsured Rates in the San Luis Valley by Federal Poverty Level, 2015















Underinsurance in the San Luis Valley, 2013-2015










More Residents in the San Luis Valley are Skipping Care Because of Cost

Percentage of San Luis Valley Residents in the Past Year Who Did Not ...










Increased Coverage Isn't Translating Into Better Access to Care




Mental Health in the San Luis Valley

CHAS: How It Was Fielded



Who: 10,136 randomly selected households

What: Twenty-minute telephone survey

When: Between March 2 and June 26, 2015

Where: Statewide, divided among 21 Health Statistics Regions

Why: To gather information that can inform policy-making and help measure health reform efforts
