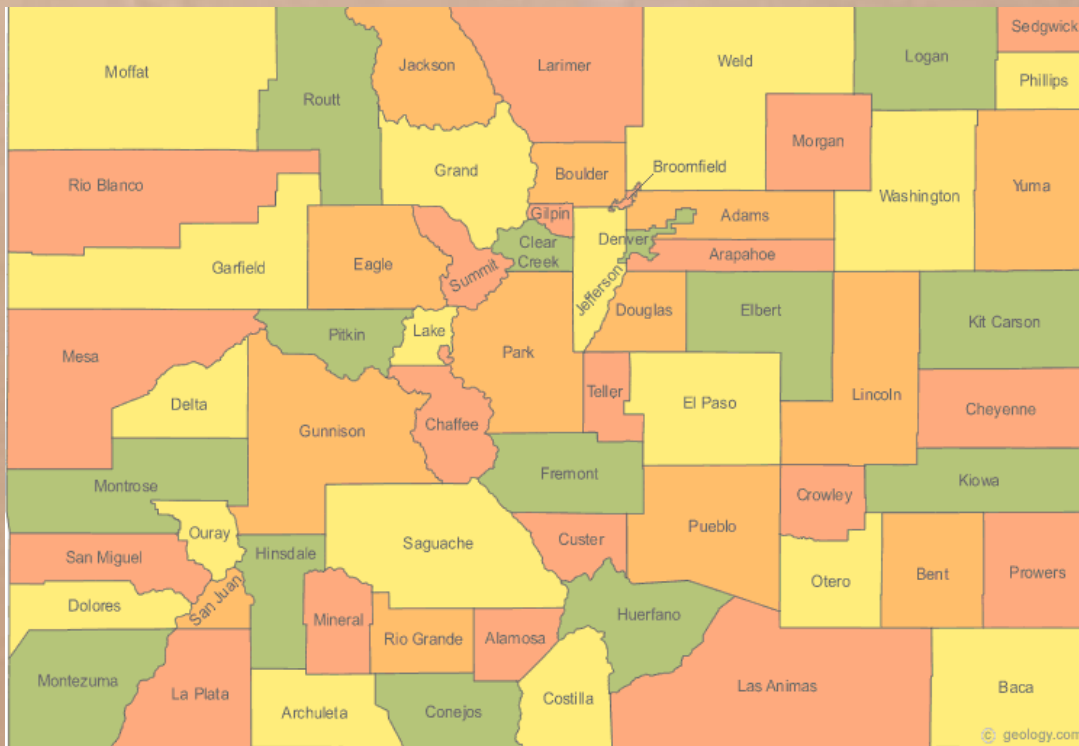

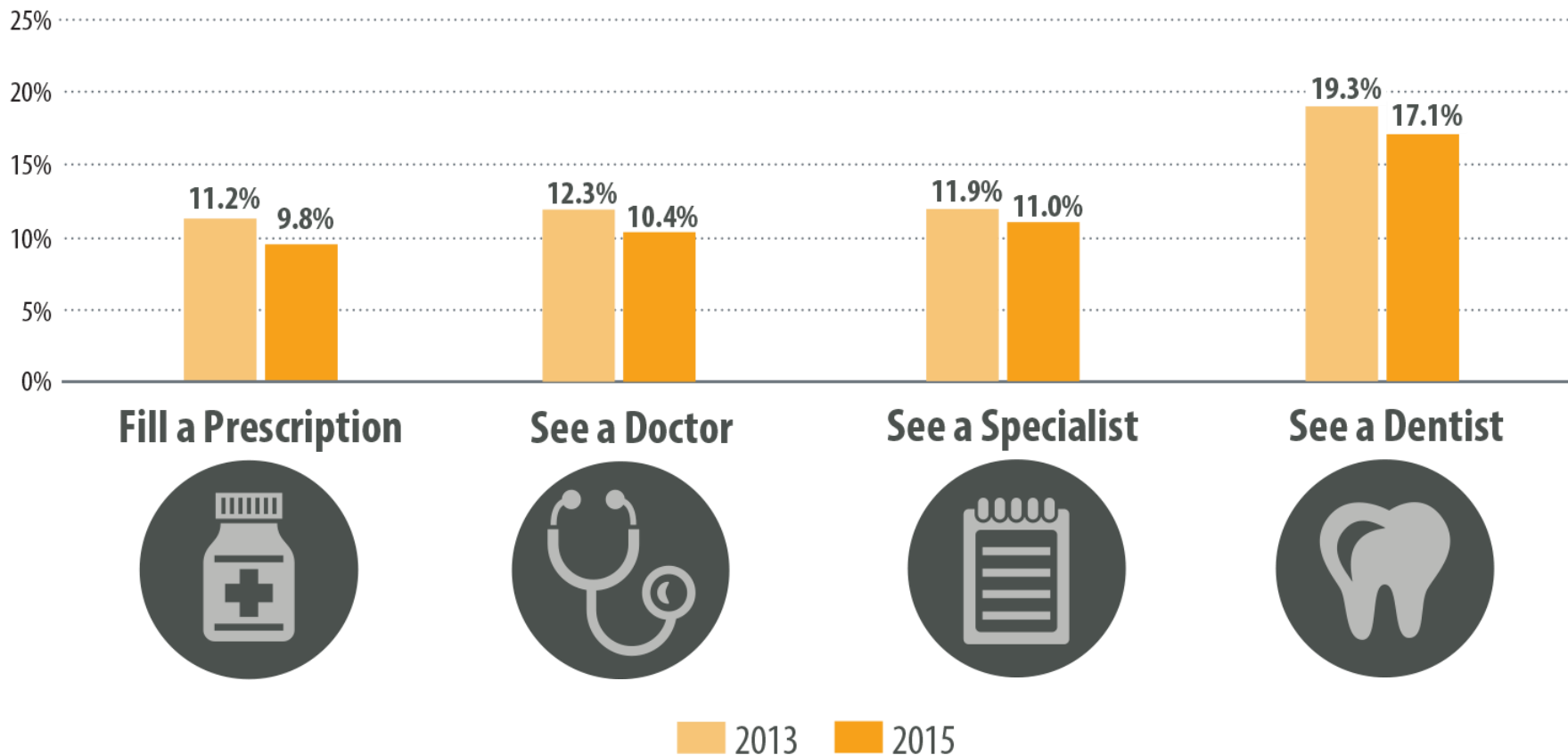
- Explore “who is doing what to address specialty care access?” with SNAC.

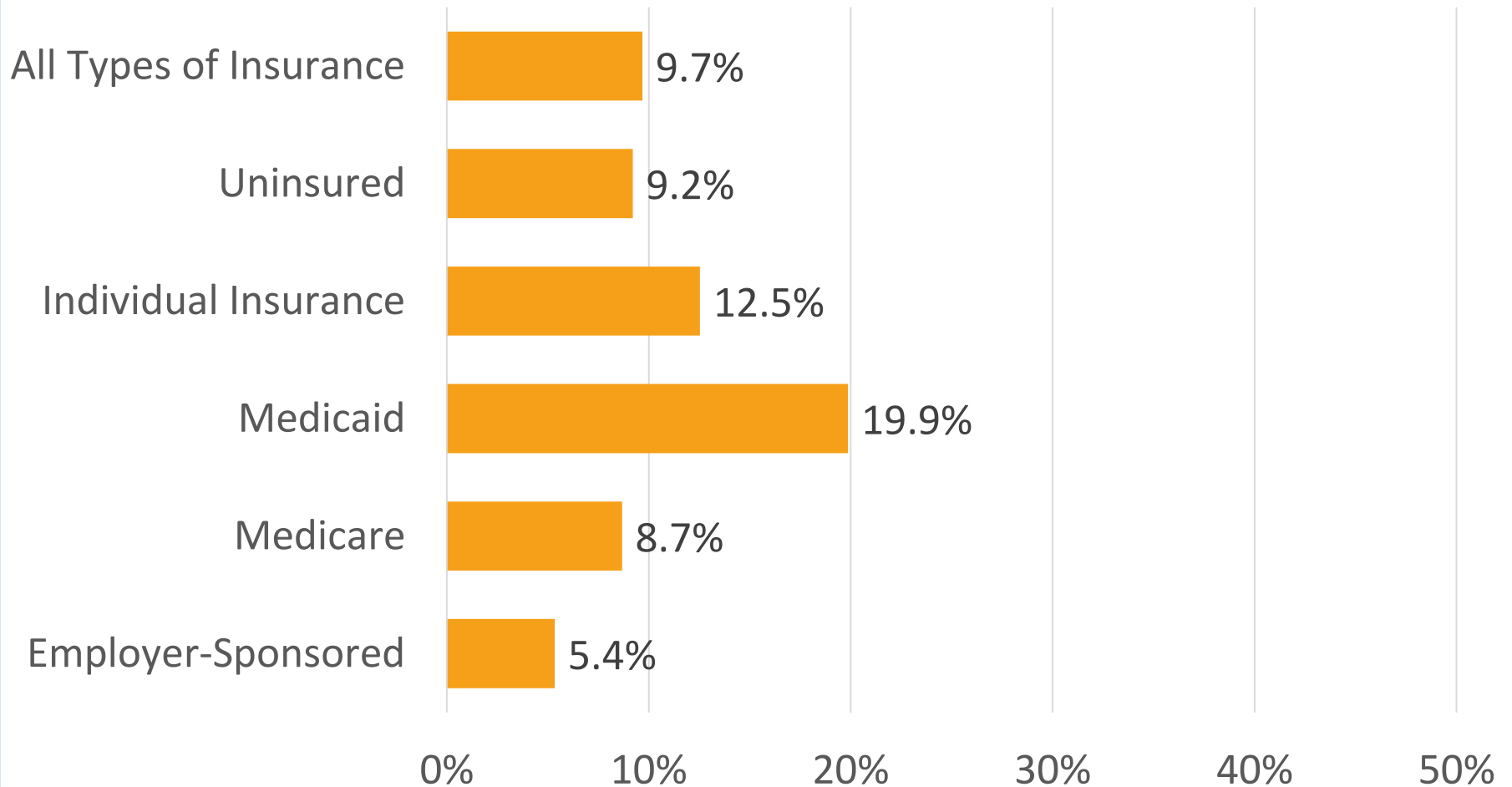
Skipping Care Because of Cost, 2013-2015

Percentage of Coloradans in the Past Year Who Did Not ...



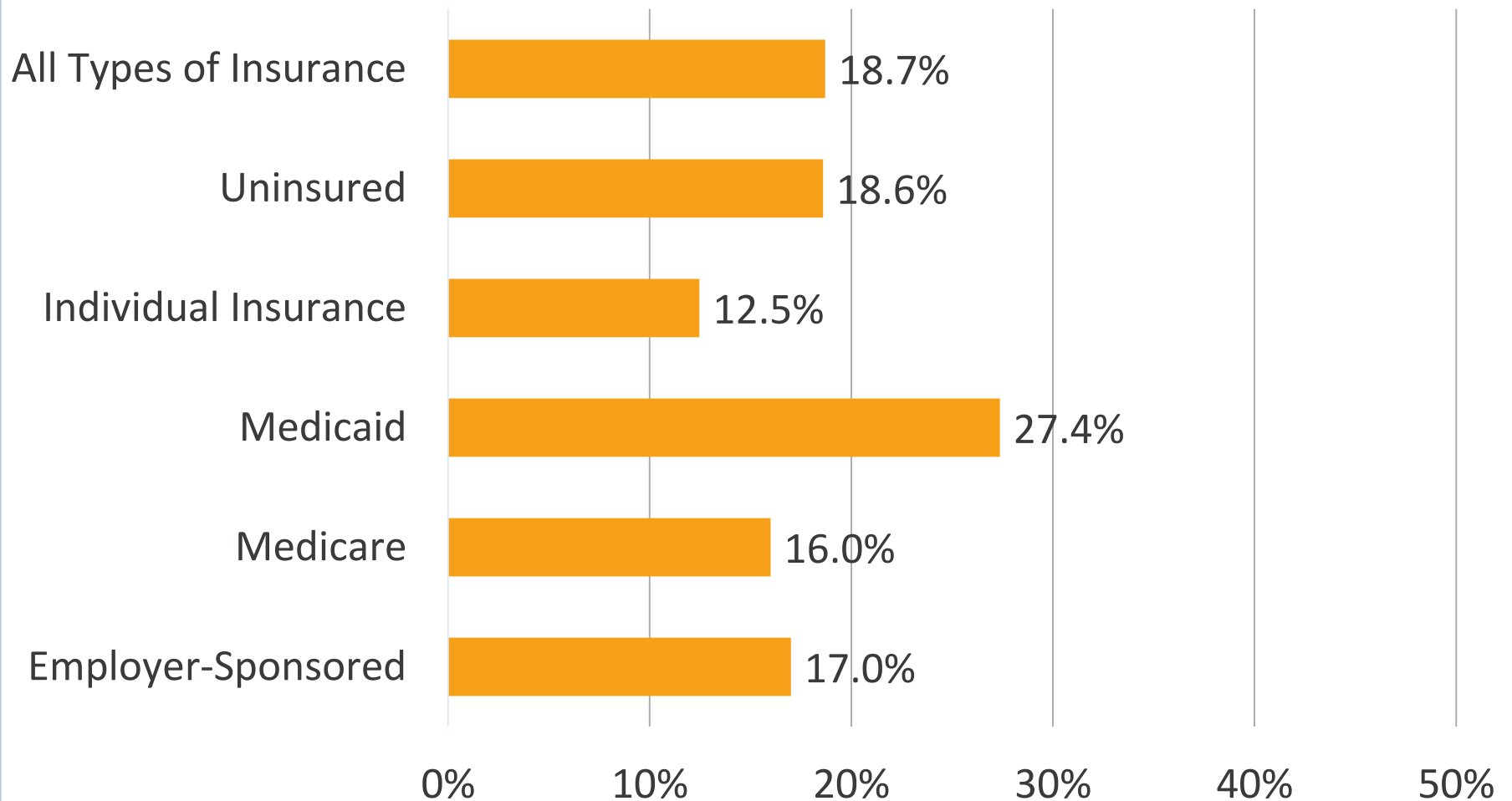
