# **Examples of Our Work**



#### Colorado Lotus Project

The Colorado AAPI Circle partnered with CHI to create the Colorado Lotus Project, a groundbreaking

effort to uplift the experiences of Asian American and Native Hawaiian and other Pacific Islander people in Colorado. This project combined quantitative analysis with novel data disaggregation modeling techniques to highlight communities that are often lost in the data. CHI brought its community engagement, storytelling, and design skills to the project.





#### Metro Denver Partnership for Health and Mental Health Ambassadors

CHI serves as the administrative and fiscal hub for the Metro Denver Partnership for Health (MDPH), a coalition committed to improving health through regional collaboration and action in the Denver metro area. CHI supports MDPH with governance, facilitation and convening, research, and fiscal and administrative services. Through MDPH, CHI administers a mental health ambassador program that equips community liaisons with the information and resources they need

to help reduce mental health stigma in their communities.





#### Colorado Birth Through Five Needs Assessment

CHI partnered with the Colorado Department of Early Childhood to

identify gaps and opportunities to better support children birth through age 5 and their families. The report explored the child care needs and

preferences of parents and the system's capacity to meet those needs. CHI combined quantitative data analysis with its expertise in qualitative data collection and analysis through focus groups, key informant interviews, and direct parent engagement.





#### American Rescue Plan Act Financial Map

The American Rescue Plan Act of 2021 brought an unprecedented

infusion of federal dollars into state governments. To support efforts to wisely use this funding, CHI created a financial map to track the more than \$9 billion that flowed into Colorado's state government, cities and counties, school districts, transportation authorities, and safety net clinics. The interactive financial map identified specific programs and entities that were receiving funding, allowing for coordination and thoughtful planning.





### Colorado Health Access Survey

Data and analysis from the Colorado Health Access Survey underpins much of CHI's work. Conducted since 2009, this biennial survey of more than 10,000 households is a key source of data on the health of

Coloradans, their interactions with the health care system, the impact of major health care policy developments, and the social factors that affect their health. The large sample size allows for analysis based on geographic and demographic factors. CHI brings its expertise in survey development, quantitative data collection and analysis, data disaggregation, data visualization, and storytelling to the survey — and the findings help inform much of the work we do for clients. The data is also accessible on our website, allowing members of the community to use the findings to advance their own work.
