
The ability to have affordable health insurance and to receive timely health care services is very important. There is overwhelming research from multiple studies showing that people without health insurance are less likely to receive preventive care, are frequently diagnosed when their diseases are more advanced, tend to receive less therapeutic care and are more likely to die prematurely than individuals with insurance. Yet access to health care is increasingly out of reach for a growing number of Coloradans – particularly individuals and families who historically have been ignored and underserved in the health care system, and those who are most vulnerable.

The Colorado Health Access Survey (CHAS) – a program of The Colorado Trust that provides extensive information about health

insurance, access and utilization of health care services – reports that more than 1.5 million, or nearly one in three Coloradans, have either no health insurance at all, or their health insurance does not adequately cover the costs of medically necessary services relative to family income. These data from the 2011 survey represent an increase since the baseline survey in 2008-2009 of an additional 176,000 individuals who are uninsured or underinsured across our state.

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



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
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Map: Uninsured Rates by Region* in Colorado, 2011












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Map: Uninsured Rates by Region* in Colorado, 2011




The ability to have affordable health insurance and to receive timely health care services is very important. There is overwhelming research from multiple studies showing that people without health insurance are less likely to receive preventive care, are frequently diagnosed when their diseases are more advanced, tend to receive less therapeutic care and are more likely to die prematurely than individuals with insurance. Yet access to health care is increasingly out of reach for a growing number of Coloradans – particularly individuals and families who historically have been ignored and underserved in the health care system, and those who are most vulnerable.

The Colorado Health Access Survey (CHAS) – a program of The Colorado Trust that provides extensive information about health

insurance, access and utilization of health care services – reports that more than 1.5 million, or nearly one in three Coloradans, have either no health insurance at all, or their health insurance does not adequately cover the costs of medically necessary services relative to family income. These data from the 2011 survey represent an increase since the baseline survey in 2008-2009 of an additional 176,000 individuals who are uninsured or underinsured across our state.

This snapshot report provides highlights of 2011 CHAS data for the State of Colorado and for the region comprised of Baca, Bent, Cheyenne, Crowley, Elbert, Huerfano, Kiowa, Kit Carson, Las Animas, Lincoln, Otero and Prowers counties. 




