

For four years now, the Report Card has served as a yard stick to measure how we are doing on a wide range of health measures. In order to see how Colorado has fared over time, we compared the last three year's life stages and indicators side-by-side. Unfortunately, as this document shows, we have not made appreciable progress in any of the life stages. But change takes time, and we will continue to monitor the indicators to make sure we stay on the task of achieving our vision that, together, we will make Colorado the healthiest state in the nation.
